Welcome & Approval of prior drafted meeting minutes	Jon Pierpont welcomed the group. a. Joint Commission Minutes from August 13, 2019 b. Advisory Committee Minutes from October 30, 2019	No quorum. Unable to vote and approve prior drafted meeting minutes. Minutes will be voted on at the next meeting.
Educational Priorities for 2020	Nathan Auck (USB E) referred to the USB E Equity Labs slideshow to review the updates. a. Addressing Student Equity b. Early Learning Program Requests and Legislative Priorities. Nathan Auck referred to the Early Learning Business Cases Handout to explain the requests. Tracy Gruber provided an analysis on the 3 budget requests; <i>Professional Development Funding Request, Optional Enhanced Kindergarten, and Access to High-Quality Preschool.</i> i. Jon Pierpont stated USB E can go back to Superintendent Sydnee Dickson to let her know the Commission will support the one request in the Governor’s budget and regarding policy will support the other two. USB E will need to go back to the Legislature to get the Legislature to support them on the other two financially.	
Update on Utah’s Plan for a Stronger Future	a. Tracy Gruber referred to pages 47-55 from the IGP Annual report during presentation. Ms. Gruber expressed that progress has been made in most areas of child wellbeing, particularly significant progress in Early Child Hood Development and Education.	
Agency research plan for the 2020	a. Various Agencies to report on their research plan for 2020 Nune Phillips provided an update on the IGP Research Subcommittee activities and stated that	

report	<p>they have met and discussed draft research proposals and mentioned they are working on long term analysis on IGP folks. They have formed a <i>2023 IGP Work Group</i> which will allow data going into the Utah data research center to identify pathways for families and identify things to help get them off that path, but are still in the early stages of conversations.</p> <p>Ms. Phillips provided summaries of on behalf of the agencies.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. DWS Research plan is to do a deep dive into the labor force attachment data, looking at the cohort over time with factors around employer attachment, workforce attachment on a quarter by quarter basis, as well as industry attachment and annual wage growth. ii. Utah System of Technical Colleges proposal is to look at the duration and outcomes of graduation rates for both IGP and non-IGP individuals. This data will show the differences between IGP and non IGP as well as the rates of completion. iii. USBE proposal will be to look at the IGP families to better understand the touch points; extended day Pre-K. iv. Utah Dept. of Health proposal is to hone in on the low birth weight among children in Utah; IGP families, low-income families that are not IGP and comparing that with the General population to better understand that particular set of families. v. Dept. of Human Services proposal is to look across many divisions within the Dept. Of Human Services to better understand when a family comes in for one service, the other services they may be receiving from other division agencies. <p>Ms. Gruber relayed the importance of the work being done from agency to agency.</p> <p>Ms. Phillips to go back to the research committee to see if possible to share the data broken down by County/Municipality to help show how Counties Compare.</p>

Ms. Freigang explained to increase this up to 100+ families; it would be done by scaling to the model size in question since it is case management based. Ms. Freigang indicated they started the process by meeting with groups through nonprofit agencies who have that trusted relationship with the families already established and spoke with the families at the nonprofit activities. ii.
